Since the articles in the books were not in chronological order, items were best found by going through article titles and pages in each volume. This index is intended to make it easier to find particular subjects on the history of Oneonta and communities in Otsego, Delaware, Chenango, Broome and Schoharie counties.

Subject headings in the index are followed by sets of numbers. The first number in each set refers to the volume, the second number to the page in that volume.
